EYFS Curriculum – History Links

Early Years Foundation Stage

History is taught in Early Years through child-initiated and adult led and guided activities. In Early Years, history makes a significant contribution to developing a child's understanding of the world through activities which involve explore some significant individuals and exploring the concept of 'new and old'.

During the EYFS, pupils should:

- Begin to make sense of their own life-story and family's history.
- Comment on images of familiar situations in the past.
- Talk about the lives of people around them and their roles in society.
- Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.
- Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.
