Home-School-Child Partnership Agreement

An effective education can be well supported by a successful partnership between home, child and school. Expectations are listed below to help us work together for the benefit of the children.

A. In order for the school to fulfil their aims, children and parents can expect school to:

- provide a safe, happy and stimulating learning environment
- provide equal opportunities for all pupils
- provide high quality learning and teaching experiences and encourage pupils to do their best at all times
- encourage pupils to respect their community and environment in school and beyond
- encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own behaviour and understand the impact their behaviour has on others
- provide a creative, experiential curriculum which meets the needs of each pupil as well as fulfilling legislative requirements
- provide parents with feedback about their child's learning on request and at parent teacher consultations and via the annual report
- keep parents informed of school activities through regular newsletters, Parentmail, texts and website updates
- contact parents quickly if there are concerns about attendance, well-being, behaviour, progress or attitude to learning
- be open and welcoming to parents, offering opportunities to become involved in daily school life
- follow safeguarding procedures, in line with the school and MAT safeguarding policy if a safeguarding concern is raised

B. In order for the school to fulfil their aims, children and the school expect parents to:

- model positive behaviours and treat all staff with respect
- take responsibility for your child's behaviour inside and outside of school, including the use of appropriate language
- ensure that your child attends school regularly, punctually and ready to learn – classroom doors open at 8.40am ready for a prompt 8.50am start.
- ensure that your child wears the correct school uniform, including P.E. kit
- ensure arrangements are in place for your child to return from school safely at the end of the school day and the school is informed of these arrangements
- comply with the governors' policy to not bring cars onto the school site, except in exceptional circumstances agreed by the headteacher;
- let the school know of the reason for any absence by telephone on the first day before 9.00am
- let the school know of anything which may affect the work, behaviour or welfare of your child
- support your child in completing home learning activities
- take an active interest in your child's learning by attending parent-teacher consultations
- get involved in your child's life in school
- avoid taking holiday during the term time;
- support the school's policies and guidelines
- ensure the school has up-to-date contact and emergency details
- pay any fees, monies etc promptly to reduce administration costs
- appreciate that curriculum enhancing trips can only take place upon receipt of voluntary contributions towards the cost of the trip
